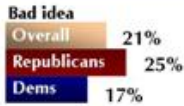


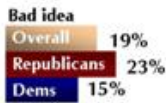

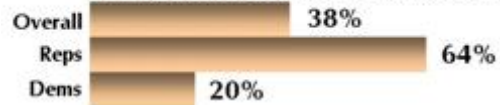
### Support for Timeline for Withdrawal

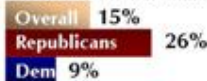
### Fear of US Military Force and Acquiring WMD
